The LLF Project in the Sodbury Vale Benefice

Readers of this magazine may be interested to know that a group of twenty people met at the Church Centre during February and March of this year to complete a 5 session course for groups called '*Living in Love and Faith*'.

What is LLF? This is a national Church of England initative supported by the Archbishops which invited



people across the country to consider, reflect and examine our changing social attitudes about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage - issues which have been the source of painful divisions in the Church over recent years.

How did it work? An excellent range of learning materials were available to us, commissioned and commended by the House of Bishops which had set up advisory groups in Biblical studies, Theology, History and the social & biological sciences to offer advice and support. We used a range of resources comprising:

- A course handbook
- A new book: 'Living in Love and Faith: Christian teaching and learning about identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage'
- Podcasts
- Video films
- Online library

As facilitators, it was mine and Hennie's job to provide opportunities for everyone to prepare each week, work together in pairs and small groups and ensure there was space to listen to different views and reactions.

What did we learn? Our task was to listen and learn together in love and faith and to be aware of our own stories, values and prejudices particularly when we encountered people in the video films whose life, faith and Church experiences were similar to and radically different from our own. For example:

Alex and Jo who are both United Reform ministers living in Scarborough, married and living in a stable lesbian relationship

Bill, Jayne - parents of son, Luke - who worked through the shock of seeing their son 'come out' as a gay man

Julie and Alice living in Cheshire, who talked about their stable relationship together and their warm acceptance in their local Church where Julie is a Lay Reader and Alice the verger

Elaine and Alan from Cambridge who talked intimately about their marriage relationship and their family of three sons and 6 grandchildren

David (later Debbie) married to Stephanie – both teachers - who shared their struggle with David's transition to a female identity

It was a real privilege for me to be a part of this group and the experience certainly enabled me to move in my own thinking to a place of deeper acceptance of a great truth, that despite the differences and diversity of our upbringing, gender and sexuality, we are all children of the universe and infinitely beloved by God. My warm appreciation to everyone for their participation.






The organ was dedicated by David Bowers at a communion service on February 6th.

Making a Difference

If you haven't visited the newly refurbished Health and Refill shop , *Nature's Choice* in Horse Street in Chipping Sodbury then I recommend that you make this a priority. Karen Morris the owner has thoughtfully refurbished the shop and as well as a wide range of health products on sale, Karen has taken seriously the threat to our plant from plastic waste, and now sells re- fills of many household cleaning products. Take along any container and you can fill it with any of the following:

- washing up liquid,
- multi purpose cleaners,
- laundry liquid,
- hand wash
- fabric conditioner.



In addition to this Karen is trying to reduce plastic waste by selling biodegradable bamboo wipes, shampoo and conditioner bars and plant based cleaning implements. The coconut husk scraper I bought works every bit as well as steel wool!

Loose herbs are displayed in a splendid array of glass jars and you can purchase from the large collection as much or as little as you need.

Many other eco -friendly products are on sale, recycled toilet tissue, and my favourite – an Eco egg filled with plant pellets that is placed in your machine on top of your washing. After 70 washes refill pellets can be purchased. Since discovering this product I have used it for all my washing and it cleans really well even the extremely muddy towels I use to clean my dog! Paraben free shampoos/soaps, bamboo toothbrushes, organic cotton buds/pads, cosmetic cleansing pads that can be washed and reused are also some of the other environmentally friendly products on sale.

Where possible packaging is compostable and Karen uses environmentally friendly companies that limit or eliminate packaging in deliveries.

Karen and her staff are enthusiastic about researching the best environmentally friendly products on our behalf and are very committed to the philosophy "*Not everybody can do everything but everyone can do something*"

Do support Karen in her new venture. Her shop allows us to shop ethically and thoughtfully and to play our own small part in cutting plastic waste and reducing pollution.

Horton Hosts Bell Ringers AGM


